Multiculturalism

In 1770, [James Cook](#) sailed along and mapped the east coast, which he named New South Wales and claimed for Great Britain.^[45]

With the loss of its American colonies in 1783, the British Government sent a fleet of ships, the "[First Fleet](#)", under the command of Captain [Arthur Phillip](#), to establish a new [penal colony](#) in New South Wales. A camp was set up and the flag raised at [Sydney Cove](#), [Port Jackson](#), on 26 January 1788,^[16] a date which became Australia's national day, [Australia Day](#), although the British [Crown Colony](#) of New South Wales was not formally promulgated until 7 February 1788. The first settlement led to the foundation of [Sydney](#), and the exploration and settlement of other regions.

In the 2016 Australian census, the most commonly nominated ancestries were [English](#) (36.1%), [Australian](#) (33.5%),^[227] [Irish](#) (11.0%), [Scottish](#) (9.3%), [Chinese](#) (5.6%), [Italian](#) (4.6%), [German](#) (4.5%), [Indian](#) (2.8%), [Greek](#) (1.8%), and [Dutch](#) (1.6%).^[228] The Indigenous population—[Aborigines](#) and [Torres Strait Islanders](#)—was counted at 649,171 (2.8% of the total population)

English is the only language spoken in the home for close to 72.7% of the population. The next most common languages spoken at home are [Mandarin](#) (2.5%), [Arabic](#) (1.4%), [Cantonese](#) (1.2%), [Vietnamese](#) (1.2%) and [Italian](#) (1.2%).^[260] Australia has a [sign language](#) known as [Auslan](#), which is the main language of about 5,500 deaf people.^[264]
